LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

Therefore the Lord Himself shall give you a sign. Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a Son, and His name shall be called Emmanuel. — Isaias 7:14

A DVENT, the great and holy season is a time of new beginnings: it is the Liturgical "new year" for the Holy Church and our time to prepare for the Coming of the Lord.

How can it already be another beginning of Liturgical Year? I seems like we just took down the purple from Lent yet the purple returns in anticipation of our Newborn King. This has been a rough year on many fronts; we lost several lifetime parishioners who went to their eternal reward (in the grace of the Sacraments), a few moved away, and we have really struggled to meet our financial obligations. This often concerns me, not because we "need" money, but it inhibits our ability to do for others. We must always share what we have with those in want, and for us at S. Francis to do such we need the generosity of others. Keeping the doors open are just a small part of this apostolate, trying to aid the needy and bring the Holy Mass and Faith to others in other locations must always be in our intentions both in prayer and in action.

The surest sign of a living actualized grace in the soul is Apostolic Zeal: the burning desire to share the Gospel of Our Lord and King and bring the Faith to all we meet. Not just by words,

but by action, as S. James teaches us, Faith without works is dead (S. James 2:17). Indeed, the Saviour teaches us that we must be active in His work by holy deeds, as this is the will of the Father, lest we be unprofitable before Him (cf. S. Matthew 7:20-23).

There is always a careful balance we must keep, witnessing His Gospel without becoming a sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal (cf. I Corinthians 13:1)...in other words, an unpleasant and distracting noise! The pious layman, because he has no formal vocation as a messenger of the Gospel, must witness the Lord by his holy behaviour, thereby sanctifying himself, his family and his community.



This is always perfectly recapitulated by the expression of S. Francis of Assisi: preach the Gospel always...when necessary use words. A smile or friendly greeting, always coupled with "God bless you," will do more than standing on the corner with a "The End is Near" sign...something about honey and vinegar.

There are those who try and threaten conversion and sanctification...alas, the rack has never worked. I am often shocked when I am told by people who,

repeating what they have read on line, that so and so is an heretic, or this persona is in hell. To my knowledge, the Holy Church has never solemnly proclaimed a person is in hell (apart from the logical assumption of Judas), but after due diligence, proclaims who is in heaven! Alas, this is what happens when nothing logical, holy or good comes from NewRome: the central guiding authority of the Church is on hiatus...thank goodness we have two thousand years of constant teaching, doctrine and legislation to guide us during this time.

So as we begin this new Liturgical Year I exhort you all: seek ye the Kingdom of God (S. Luke 12:31)! Continue to invite (without threat) friends and family to our little Oratory Chapel; be examples of piety and modesty by your reverence and modesty, especially when in Chapel. Show them how good the True Faith is rather than lecturing them about it...as Father Anselm Marie is wont to say: the only one who wins an argument is the devil.

I will renew my pledge: for every new personal that you bring to S. Francis this year I will have an Holy Mass said for you and for them. Let's see who takes advantage of that grace!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Is there a reason to believe that the Jews are a "cursed" people because they rejected Christ and gave Him over to the Romans for execution? This would seem to make sense since they have been persecuted for thousands of years. What does the Church teach on this?

Thank you for your e-mail question - some early Church Fathers, especially S. Augustine, felt that the Jews had placed a curse upon themselves from the reasons you stated in your email. S. Paul, whom S. Augustine is basically following in thought on this point, is not as determined to curse the Jews: For you, brethren, are become followers of the churches of God which are in Judea, in Christ Fesus: for you also have suffered the same things from your own countrymen, even as they have from the Fews, Who both killed the Lord Jesus, and the prophets, and have persecuted us, and please not God, and are adversaries to all men (I Thessalonians 2:14-15). The Apostle is condemning those who immediately harmed the Prophets and Our Lord and those who would not accept Our Lord as Messias and God, including himself. Our Lord, when prophesying His own death in Jerusalem says: Behold, I cast out devils, and do cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I am consummated. Nevertheless I must walk today and tomorrow, and the day following, because it cannot be that a prophet perish, out of Jerusalem. Jerusalem, Jerusalem, that killest the prophets, and stonest them that are sent to thee, how often would I have gathered thy children as the bird doth her brood under her wings, and thou wouldest not? Behold your house shall be left to you desolate (S. Luke 13:32-35). This is more about sinful men who reject those sent by God and do not convert themselves.

There is nothing in the Scriptures that speaks of an enduring or hereditary curse upon the former Chosen People of God, and certainly nothing in the Scriptures that would recommend, let alone condone, the persecution of the Jewish people.

The persecution of them by Christians after Christianity became the main religion of Rome and Europe is an unfortunate and sinful use of vengeance, which belongs to God alone.

Eighth of December is the great feast of the IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY: an Holy Day of Obligation. The Faithful must attend Holy Mass and refrain from unnecessary servile work. Holy Mass will be offered at 8:00 am and 10:00 am.

The Faithful are also reminded that the day before (Friday the 7th) is a day of FAST (those from age 21 – 59 may only have ONE full meal with two smaller meals) and ABSTINENCE (no meat for those over 7 years of age).


