# LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

OR a Child is born to us, and a son is given to us, and the government is upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called, Wonderful, Counsellor, God the Dighty, the Sather of the world to come, the Prince of Peace.

Emmanuel. — Isaias 9:6

UR Christmas joy is now upon us, and we should do all we can to sustain it throughout the year. The simplest way to do this is to remain in the grace of God. Frequent Confession and worthy reception of Our Lord in Holy Communion is the best way to do this.

Another good practice to sustain your joy is by leading a life of great devotion, most especially to Our Lord and King, Jesus Christ. On the 2nd of January the Church will commemorate the Most Holy Name of the Lord. At one time every parish had a Holy Name Society, originally called the Confraternity of the Most Holy Name of God and Jesus. The Confraternity helped spread zealous and holy devotion the Name of the Lord and well combatted the sins of perjury and blasphemy, immorality that invades society.

Blessed Peter reminds us that in no other name is man saved, as well as healed, both physically *and* spiritually (cf. Acts 4:12). The Apostle also reminds us *That in the name of* 

JESUS every knee should bow, of those that are in heaven, on earth, and under the earth (Philippians 2:10).

The other great devotion every Catholic must have is to the Holy Mass. With this in mind let us consider more about this very important devotion: devotion to the Holy Mass begins with understanding it, especially the actions, prayers and readings of the Mass. The greatest tool for understanding the Holy Mass is a proper Hand Missal: the only two that I recommend are the Saint Andrew's and the Father Lasance. After obtaining a proper hand missal you should explore it and read all the Liturgical Notes that accompany all the readings of the feasts. Without an hand missal one cannot properly pray the Holy Mass, and without praying at Holy Mass one is simply an inactive "passerby" missing the graces and wonders of a deeper spiritual life.



And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt amoung us!

Praying along with the Mass also helps one to concentrate, and that concentration will soon lead to

meditation. It is this meditation that allows the mind and the soul to enter into a deeper and more fruitful relationship with the Holy Mass: this creates a greater and long lasting devotion.

The beauty and treasury of the Most Holy and Catholic Mass has made great saints: one only has to read the lections of the Divine Office and Holy Mass composed by that great saint of the Holy Church, S. Thomas Aquinas, to see that you are reading the liturgical literature of a man in love with his Lord and God made manifest in the Holy Mass. The sublime teachings of the Doctors of the Church all have the very same source: devotion to the Holy Mass.

Learn the Holy Mass that you may know it and love it: for loving the Holy Mass is loving God Himself through your spiritual participation in His worship and adoration.

In your previous teachings you have mentioned that modern "Vatican 2 Catholics" have departed so far from the authentic Faith that they no longer are able to distinguish truth from error. How can we help "convert" them to real Catholicism?

Your question is very important and contains great charity because your desire is to help others save their souls and go to heaven!

Most modern Catholics, as you say, are unaware that they no longer hold even the most basic of dogmatic truths, perhaps this is where the invincible ignorance theory comes play...but to your question: the first thing we must all do is pray for them, whether they be liberal. moderate or traditional-ish Conciliar Catholics. primary obligation is to always pray for those in need, and they are in the greatest of spiritual because they need have (unknowingly or even knowingly) been deprived of the true Holy Catholic Faith, and in most cases true Holy Catholic Sacraments, which deprives them from Sacramental much Grace. needed to save their souls.

Next we must teach them true and sound doctrine by

teaching and example. One of the simplest things I do, which almost always elicit comments or questions is making the Sign of the Cross and saying Grace before and after meals in public. Another witness is that if I am invited to some type of function or gathering on a Friday I always let my host know that I do not eat meat on that day as a Religious Obligation, this way I do not surprise or embarrass them or myself by not eating what is put in front of me.

Lastly, the best way to convert anyone is to know the Holy Faith yourself and to defend it and not argue about it—the only one who wins an argument is the devil...

This is why I spend so much time teaching about the Holy Faith in my sermons and in the Faith Lectures I offer. As a young man once remarked to me, to detect a *forgery* one must first study and thoroughly know the *real* thing.

He closed his eyes and reminisced about Patricia; gone now for these past three Christmases. How she loved Midnight Mass and always made her lovely meatless dishes for their Vigil

He remembered how she was so excited to see all the little children and would sneakily hand them little candy canes while bringing her finger to her lips as if to say "sh, this is our little secret." SUNDAYS OF JANUARY: THE CATHOLIC HAND MISSAL

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for January:

5 January 2020:

Most Holy Name of Jesus: commemoration of the Vigil of the Epiphany and S. Telesphorus at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

12 January 2020

Holy Family Sunday: commemoration of Sunday within the Octave of the Epiphany and the Octave at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

19 January 2020

Second Sunday after the Epiphany: commemoration of S. Marius & Companions and S. Canute at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

26 January 2020

Third Sunday after the Epiphany: commemoration of S. Polycarp at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of the day, i.e., Introit, Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Gradual, Alleluia, Tract or Gospel, Sequence, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.


