LETTER FROM THE MONSIGNOR

Who is she that cometh forth as the morning rising, fair as the moon, bright as the sun, terrible as an army set in array? — Canticles 6:9

FTER driving out the pagans from Hungary, Pope Sylvester II crowned Saint Stephen as King of the Hungarians (Szent István Király) the 25th on of December 1000 (two hundred years to the day that Pope S. Leo III crowned Charlemagne Holy Roman Emperor). Pious legend tells us that upon his return to Hungary, he laid his emblems of kingship at the foot of the Blessed Virgin Mary and proclaimed her Magyarorszáy Királynője, that is, Queen of Hungary. The saintly king then proclaimed the Feast of the Assumption a national Holy Day with Solemn Masses, Processions and other pious obversances. To this day the people of Hungary have great devotion to Our Lady and due to the love of her they remain faithful to the Catholic Faith. Our Lady of Hungary has preserved the Faith with her maternal care and aid for over a thousand years.

One of the greatest devotions in the Holy Church is that of Our Lady as the Blessed Virgin Mary, Destroyer of All Heresies. S. Pope Pius X confimed this title of Our Lady in his monumental work against the heresy of Modernism

the encyclical *Pascendi Dominici Gregis* (8 September 1907). The veracity of the Holy Mother of God being despied by heretics, pagans and deamons and loved by devout Catholics is obvious and demonstrable.

In very recent times the modernist heretics of the NewChurch have attempted to coalese proper true devotion of the Blessed Virgin earth/mother pagan goddesses like the *Devi*, *Gaia*, and most recently Pachamama of the Amazonians. This is, of ocurse, a purposeful move by the NewChurch to harmonise the religions of the world into a One World Relgion that it relative to politics and cultural whims, where everything would and must be tolerated except for the One True Faith of the Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church.

This wicked and dangerous syncretism has at its core a hate for God and His

revealed religion, and, of course, a hatred of God's own mother, the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Contrariwise, the faithful Catholic agrees with the opening words of Pope Pius XII in his encyclical *Ad Cali Reginam* (11 October 1954):

From the earliest ages of the Catholic Church a Christian people, whether in time of triumph or more especially in time of crisis, has addressed prayers of petition and hymns of praise and veneration to the Queen of Heaven. And never has that hope wavered which they placed in the Mother of the Divine King, Jesus Christ; nor has that faith ever failed by which we are taught that Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, reigns with a mother's solicitude over the entire world, just as she is crowned in heavenly blessedness with the glory of a Queen.

During this time when souls are being lost by the lies and deceit of the NewChurch enemies we *must* seek the aid of Our Lady; that she **destroys** their errors and **converts** their hearts and minds. Let us lay our hopes at her feet that she may intercede on our behalf before the Throne of her Divine Son, Our Lord and King Jesus Christ!

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Hello Monsignor: Is the Latin Rite the "main rite" of the Catholic Church, and why did the Latin Rite receive special importance over other Western rites such as the Gallican rite and Ambrosian rite? Also, is Latin truly the language of the Church and of the Angels, and if so why was the earlier Latin Rite infused with so much Greek?

As always ask you wonderful questions. Just a few distinctions, the Latin or Western Rite is used distinguish between those of the Western Church, offered in Latin, and those of the Eastern Rite offered in several eastern languages such as Greek, Armenian, Coptic and Ukrainian (to name just a few).

In the western Church there are various Rites, some of which you mentioned. These rites developed by the Apostles and their successors, Bishops, in various cities. The Ambrosian Rite, is named for S. Ambrose (d. 397) the Bishop of Milan, however there is no evidence direct that "created" the rite but that he helped keep it pure and in line with the approved and accepted Liturgical Rite of that City. There was also the Mozarabic Rite used in parts of Spain and Portugal, the Sarum Rite used in Salisbury and much of England, the Gallican Rite used in parts of Gaul (France), which all fell into general disuse even before Vatican II except in certain cities or Cathedrals.

Other greater rites of the Eastern Church such as the Alexandrian (used in the Coptic, Eritrean and Ethiopian Catholic Churches), the Armenian, Syro-Malabar, Chaldean and Maronite rites and the various Greek Catholic churches (Albanian, Hungarian, Melkite, Ruthenian, etc.) are still in use, but, alas, have also in recent years conformed to the NewChurch reforms and changes. Most of these Eastern Churches (always in communion with Rome) were often founded by the Apostles who brought the Holy Faith to those lands. While these rites have local variations every single one conforms to the same basic liturgical form. The KYRIE, GLORIA, CREDO, SANCTUS, BENEDICTUS, and AGNUS DEI exist in all of these holy rites of the Universal Church of Jesus Christ. The prayers of their Canons, called Anaphora (ἀναφορά the meaning carrying back in Greek) are virtually the same as the Roman Canon, again, with only slight local variations. The rite of Rome, stilled called the Roman Rite was brought to that city by Blessed Peter the Prince of the Apostles, and S. Paul. Because of the supremacy of the Apostolic See of Rome, the mother of churches, naturally this Rite took precedence over all others.

Even at the Holy Council of Trent the Church proclaimed the Roman Rite the main rite of the Catholic Church and canonised its Missal (cf. Quo Primum of 14 July 1570, S. Pope Pius V).

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As for the latter part of your question, Latin is the official language of the Western Church because it was the predominant language of the west. As the Church of the West continued to expand so did the use of Latin in the liturgy. Liturgical Other approved Languages of the East, such as Greek, were retained if those were the original languages of that Rite, however it was never the common vernacular but its more formal versions, e.g.: the Greek of the Byzantine Rite is not the spoken Greek of today, likewise the Armenian, Coptic and Arabic languages of those rites.

Lastly, I have heard that same expression of Latin being the language of the angels but that is pure pious sentiment and not doctrinal at all. The same can be said of liturgical Hebrew. Alas, the only Greek that remains in the Western Liturgy is the Kyrie and the Reproaches or Improperia Good Friday. In traditional Solemn Papal Mass there is a Greek Subdeacon and Deacon who would sing the Epistle and Gospel in Greek after the Latin Subdeacon and Deacon sing their portion of the Mass; thus demonstrating the unity of the Universal Church under the authority of the Pope.

In order to assist the faithful following Holy Mass with their hand missals here are the Sunday Masses for **April**:

3 May 2020:

Finding of the True Cross:

commemoration of the 3rd Sunday after Easter, within the Octave of S. Joseph, S. Alexander I & Comp. at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

10 May 2020

Fourth Sunday after Easter:

commemoration of S. Antonius, Ss. Gordian & Epimachus at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

17 May 2020

Fifth Sunday after Easter:

commemoration of S. Pachal Baylon at the Collect, Secret and Postcommunion.

24 May 2020

Sunday within the Octave of the Ascension:

No commemorations.

31 May 2020

Pentecost Sunday:

No commemorations.

To correctly participate at Holy Mass one *silently* unites his prayers with those of the Church through pious and attentive meditation of the prayers and reading of Holy Mass.

If you are unsure how to correctly set your hand missal arrive early for Holy Mass and ask the Monsignor to assist you. It is also important to become

familiar with the Ordinary of the Mass, those parts that never change, i.e.: Kyrie, Gloria, Creed, Sanctus, Benedictus, and the Agnus Dei. And of course the Canon of the Mass, and the Propers of the Mass, those which vary according to the feasts of Introit. the i.e., Collect(s)(after the Gloria or Dominus Vobiscum), Epistle, Tract or Gradual, Alleluia, Sequence, Gospel, Secret, Communion Verse and Post Communion. On many feasts or days there are Commemorations (additional prayers) at the Collect. Secret and Postcommunion. The careful attention to these prayers and readings will help one enter into a deeper spiritual relationship with the Holy Liturgy, the Saints and Mysteries of God.
